10 Verses about God's Love to Pick You Up

"Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be afraid, for I am your God. I will strengthen you; I will help you; I will hold on to you with my righteous right hand. (Isaiah 41:10)

God's word reaffirms the promise time and time again that He will never leave nor forsake us. His presence is reason enough to not live in fear of the circumstances or people we encounter. He says Himself that He will help, strengthen, and hold on to us with His righteousness. What a promise to believe in, and what evidence that God loves us just that much!


> "But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)
